4)	Give appropriate time for my students to think, process and express their opinion through writing, talking, drawing or other forms?		
5)	Foster two-way connection, did I share something about myself (e.g. day/event/experience) with my students?		
6)	Affirm my students that each of them is unique (and have their own gifts, talents and challenges)?		
7)	Allow my students to make mistakes as long as they have tried their best?
